PRINCIPAL NOTES

From the Principal

Now that the first day of fall has come and gone, we are looking ahead to our fall parties. We celebrate the arrival of fall with classroom parties on October 31st from 2:15-2:45 p.m. We have decided that students will be allowed to wear costumes to school and throughout the day. But first and foremost is learning. If a costume interferes with learning in the classroom, the student will be asked to change. Some children and/or their families are frightened by or sensitive to costumes that are violent, occult, macabre, or antireligious. Since the school wants to teach children to cooperate, to resolve conflicts, and to be sensitive to all points of view, costumes are not to focus on violent or frightening themes that include weapons, blood, and gore. This will require more thought and planning, but it should result in more original, creative, and fun costumes!

Costume design and content:

- No face paint or masks may be worn.
- Costumes with a scary, gory, or insulting theme are not allowed to respect the varying ages and values of every child.
- Anything that can injure or intimidate others is never allowed at school. No weapons of any kind are allowed on school property at any time. Refer to your Shawnee Mission Weapons Policy if you have guestions.

October 31st Fall Party Day:

- Costumes may be worn all day
- Costume parade will be in the back circle drive from 2:00-2:15 p.m.
- Party time is 2:15-2:45 p.m.
- Parents who come for the parade or party may take their child home when the party ends at 2:45 p.m.

Construction notes: Thank you for your patience with the continued construction on site. Progress continues and another round of seeding is scheduled this fall. Security cameras are being installed this week.

Watch the weather as it becomes more unpredictable over the fall and winter; please give yourself enough time when backups will occur in the parking lot during arrival and dismissal. Stay the course, don't use the "bus only" lane, proceed cautiously, and look both ways. We have done a great job with safety in good weather, so I anticipate that will continue.
