- Staffing the new building This district has decided to treat this consolidation as a school closing. This means that staff presently at Oak Park will remain if they desire too. Staff from Katherine Carpenter will be placed here if they so desire and their position is available. Otherwise the KC staff will submit to the district what area of the Shawnee Mission School District they would like to work in. The district standard for classroom sizes are as follows:

 - <u>Primary (K, 1st, 2nd and 3rd Grades) –</u> 24 students
 <u>Intermediate (4th, 5th and 6th Grades) –</u> 28 students
- School Student Transfers are being honored according to space availability • within staffing guidelines for class size. We will be place transfers students on a list and will be selecting them from the list based on who signed up earliest and classroom availability. We will not add classes to accommodate transfer students.

We have to go in as soon as it is ready because we are located in the second phase of the construction project. This means we will probably be moving in sometime between Nov 1st and end of the year.
